General Information	Applicants are encouraged to complete as many prerequisite courses as possible prior to submitting the application for admission. It is preferred that all science/math prerequisites be completed prior to submission of the application (human anatomy/physiology, biology, chemistry, physics, and statistics coursework), however, up to 8 hours of prerequisites, including math/science courses, are allowed to be pending at the time the application is submitted. Science courses must be what a student would take as part of a science major, and therefore courses for "non-science majors" are not accepted. Please note that all prerequisite courses must be completed with a grade of C or higher (C minus not accepted) prior to starting the DPT program and must be completed within the past 7 years. Prerequisite coursework may be retaken 2 times for a total of 3 attempts. Advanced Placement courses are not accepted. All courses must be completed at a U.S. accredited college or university. • Highly Recommended (Coursework in Clinical Kinesiology, Exercise Physiology, and a Life Science including a cellular/developmental component.) • Technology. Students must own a laptop computer & tablet. Any questions regarding technology requirements should be directed to the program prior to purchase. No formal coursework is required, however students are expected to be proficient in Microsoft Word, Excel and Power Point.
