Important dates	<p>Applications to the UWM DPT program are reviewed in two phases. The Early Priority Admission phase applies to all qualified applications received by August 17. Applications undergo a holistic review, considering all factors from the application (GPA, GRE, letters of recommendation, essay responses, observation hours, leadership, and extra-curricular activities, etc.).</p> <p>Offers in the Early Priority Admission phase will be made by October 15.</p> <p>Qualified and verified applications received after August 17 will be considered in the Rolling Admission phase, depending on availability.</p> <p>The firm application deadline is November 2, but applicants are encouraged to apply early as classes tend to fill in the Early Priority Admission phase.</p> <p>The program will retain a wait list for strong applicants that did not receive an offer.
